**Minutes of Meeting
May 21, 2009**

Children’s Saturday Afternoon Story Hour:

Presented by K. Hopf and S. Pacyga. Suggested story hour take place in the lower level. Parish hall more welcoming, estimate from J. Montstream of \$30 to hold the two hour session in the parish hall. Safe Church Training requirement – Diocese directive considered – event is two hours or less, state laws do not apply to this time span. Pilot program requires parent or adult remain with their child or children during this two hour span. Program will begin in January 2010, ending in April 2010. Six dedicated people to start-up mission program. Projecting story hour program will run from October thru April each year. Before vestry approves new program an amendment was added to thoroughly consider overall costs before committing to January 2010 start date. Re-evaluation in May following the last story hour and decision to continue program will rest with Vestry.

Rector’s Report:

- Magnetic Church conference, a 2 day growth study conference. Trinity was asked to host on October 16 and 17.
- Appreciative Inquiry Leadership training very informative.
- Will visit all shut-ins at least once before end of June.
- New acolyte—Ben Wood. Two new lector/chalice bearers Frank Perry and Carol Lush Ehmann.
- Lay Eucharist Visitors meeting on May 31st. Essential ministry to be operating by the end of June. These visits do not replace visitation by clergy but supplement them.
- Canceled Appreciative Inquiry summit. Vestry may reschedule after the transition.

Finance Report:

- Organ Repairs have been completed. An estimate of \$2,300 given for future repairs.
- A bequest of \$5K from the estate of D. Chris-

tensen has been received for the endowment fund.

- Facts and figures presented with regard to resignations. Wardens and Treasurer to meet with Canon Nobel Hanson on May 29th to discuss cost and selection of Covenant Supply Priest. Will share information with Vestry. Also, to be considered Trinity is a Type II congregation may be revised to Type I in 2010.
- As of April 30th Trinity has a deficit of \$22,000.

One Person's Opinion

One question that keeps being asked is "how did we get to this point?" The answer is simple but also complex. In short, we're here because we all assumed someone else would do something to prevent it. Some examples might help:

During his tenure as Treasurer, Bernard Astill repeatedly warned us about the gap between income and expenses, parishioners assumed given his knowledge and wisdom Bernard would figure out how to "fix" it.

Don Christensen's term as Finance Chair was one

where Don continually warned about the possibility of running out of funds with which to balance the budget. The parish was grateful for having someone as good as Don worrying about the money - so we didn't

When David John took over the Growth and Evangelism Commission, Trinity relied on David to grow the congregation. And then we wondered why it did not happen.

Using David Baker as a model we assumed the job of the Rector is to do all and be all for us – without recalling the rector is one person and clergy only make up only 1% of the church. If we want something to happen it is the 99% who must make it happen.

For years we have resisted doing an every member visitation for our Stewardship campaign because “they do not like being called on” and we are not comfortable asking for money.

And there are many other examples that could be cited. The old cartoon character Pogo was once quoted in that comic strip saying “We have met the enemy and he is us.” Our problem, as Shakespeare wrote, “is not in our stars, it is in ourselves.” Let us not waste time figuring out who to blame.

Let us take this situation not as an opportunity to look around to place blame but to unite to decide who we want to be as a parish when we grow up – and begin to do so. Let us discern where God is calling us to go from here, become that community. A community centered not on ourselves and our wants but on the community in which we are placed and to which God has commissioned us to minister in the name of the risen Christ. Growth is not a goal we can work to attain by itself but it is the by-product of good ministry and outreach to others. In the mean time, if we want Trinity to survive and to thrive we need to give unstintingly of our time, our money and talents to create the community we want to have in the future.

Treasures of History Episcopal SeniorLife Communities

The rich foundation of The Episcopal Church Home naturally gives way to special treasures of history from time to time. Founded by four Episcopalian women in 1868 with the mission of helping orphans and widows, The Episcopal Church Home has had many people stroll through the halls during its 140-plus years of caring service. One particular individual visited ECH recently, and she reflected on memories of when she *first* lived at “The Home” while in her teens.

Mrs. Jeanette Smith Ebert lived at The Episcopal Church Home from 1930 to 1938 as a young girl. She returned to The Center for Rehabilitation which is located at The Episcopal Church Home on Mt. Hope Ave. When she had to make a decision on where to receive rehabilitation care, her first choice was Episcopal SeniorLife Communities “because they offered such great care” over 7 decades ago. Times have certainly changed since then, but Mrs. Ebert says that “the care at The Episcopal Church Home has not!”

Now 88 years old, Mrs. Ebert still remembers trips to the circus, Girl Scout outings, and playing cops and robbers in the backyard of The Episcopal Church Home. She speaks fondly of the Board Members at the time who invited her over to their homes, including Mrs. Barry. She also remembers Mrs. Averill, and when the Ford St. Bridge was actually Clarissa St. Mrs. Ebert says, “You always knew the rich kids because they had angora sweaters. Well, one of the first things I bought when I had enough money saved was an angora sweater.”

At the time when Mrs. Ebert lived at what was affectionately called “The Home,” she was part of a large “family” comprised of women, children, and older adults. Monthly records from the Episcopal Church Home in the 1930s include the closing statement: “Present in the Family: Adults 26, Children 15.” The numbers changed, but the same clause remained unchanged: “. . . in the Family.” Episcopal SeniorLife Communities still exists as a family of small communities. The environment at each community, including River Edge Manor, Brentland Woods, and Seabury Woods, is close-knit and feels much like family.

The backyard of “The Home” used to be an open place for the children to play on a swing set, seesaw, and to go tobogganing. Mrs. Ebert tells of picnics by the river and watching the boats on the river.

Mrs. Ebert remembers living at Hillside for a time before moving back with her father. It was after this time that the Episcopal Church Home made the decision to focus care on older adults. Mrs. Ebert mentions that she was charged \$3.50 per week to stay at the Home. “And that was during the depression!” As we’re facing what many call a rough economical situation, she reminds people, “We lived through the first one, we’ll live through this one.”

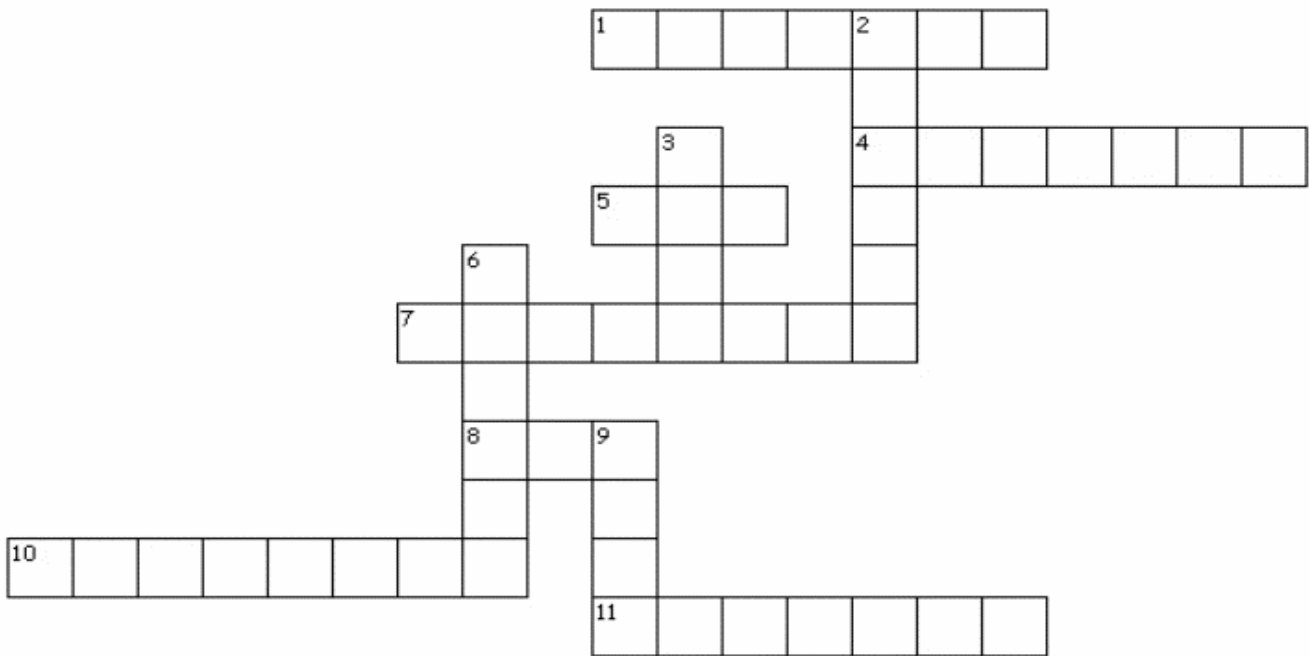

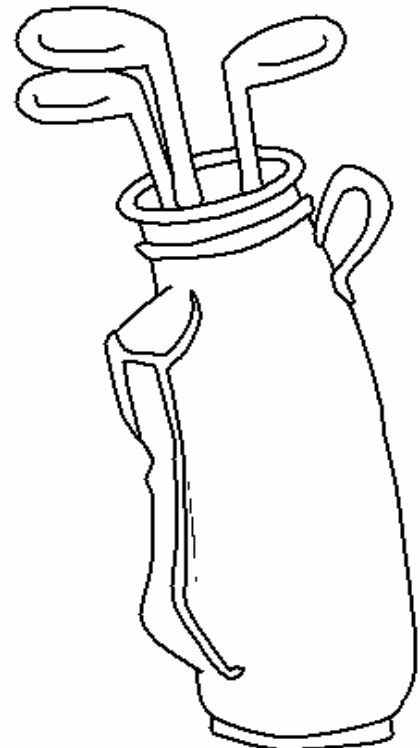
